For Information

The six colonies, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria and Western Australia united to form the Commonwealth of Australia on 1 January 1901.

On 1 March 1901 control of the postal services passed to the federal administration.

The first national postage due stamps appeared in July 1902, but it was not until January 1913 that postage stamps inscribed 'AUSTRALIA' were issued.
