It is hart to believe that, next year, 10 years have passed since we had the Olympic Games in Sydney. The sad story is that I am still finding material filling gaps for this event.


I am sure that in all your collections are gaps and, depending on the depth of our pockets, you all attempt to fill those.









opportunity to be part of a great group of people called: stamp collectors. Thanks, guys for giving me the opportunity to be part of this club.





I hope you will enjoy the next year as much as I.

Stamps Overprint 'OS' Types

The space between the letters is normally 7 mm, except on 5d and 8d (11 – 11.5 mm), 5s (12 mm) and 20s (14mm). Later printings of the 3d, are 5.5 mm. Varieties in the settings are known on the 1d (8 and 8.5mm) 2d (8.5 mm) and 3d (9mm).

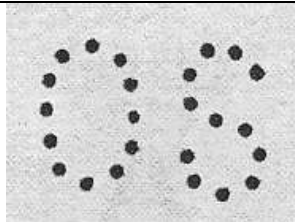

Three different duty plates, each 120 (12 x 10), were produced. The first plate contained country inscription as Type A and was only used for the 9d (1a).

The second duty plate, used for the 9d (1a) contained 117 examples of Type A and three of Type B.

The third duty plate, also used for the 9d (1b, 1c), had all inscriptions as Type B.

Three different duty plates, each 120 (12 x 10), were produced. The first plate contained country inscription as Type A and was only used for the 9d (1a).

The second duty plate, used for the 9d (1a) contained 117 examples of Type A and three of Type B.

The third duty plate, also used for the 9d (1b, 1c), had all inscriptions as Type B.

The six colonies, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Tasmania, Victoria and Western Australia united to form the Commonwealth of Australia on 1 January 1901. On 1 March 1901 control of the postal service's passed to the federal administration. The first national postage due stamps appeared in July 1902, but it was not until January 1913 that postage stamps inscribed 'AUSTRALIA' were issued.
